



ERIC N. PRYSTOWSKY EARLY CAREER RESEARCHER AWARD GUIDELINES

The Eric N. Prystowsky Early Career Researcher Award is an annual award presented to the highest scoring abstract submitted to the Clinical Electrophysiology/Catheter Ablation abstract category. It is provided through the Eric and Bonnie Prystowsky Fund.

IMPORTANT DEADLINES

All interested Eric N. Prystowsky Early Career Researcher applicants must submit their abstracts and indicate their interest before the Heart Rhythm 2023 abstract submission site closes on **December 5, 2022 11:59 PM Eastern Time**.

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

All authors must submit an abstract through the 2023 [abstract submission site](#), indicate their interest on the “Awards” section of the site. Abstracts submitted after 11:59PM Eastern Time December 5, 2022 will not be accepted. Please note that any abstract accepted into the YIA competition will not be eligible for this award.

ELIGIBILITY

This award is open to early career researchers one to five years out of Fellowship training. The research for the eligible abstract must have been substantially completed during this time period and must involve intact human subjects.

PROCESS

The Heart Rhythm 2023 Program Chair and Vice Chair will select the award winner. Award selection will be based on both relative abstract scores and relative subject matter.

NOTIFICATION

The winner will be notified via email in March 2023.

AWARDS

The winner will receive an Eric N. Prystowsky Early Career Researcher Award plaque, a cash award of \$1,500, honorary mention at Heart Rhythm 2023, and one complimentary registration to Heart Rhythm 2023.
